Dear Friends

Traditionally 'Harvest' is a time of reflection and thanksgiving. It is a time to remember with gratitude, God's amazing love for us which He demonstrates season by season. Just look at what He made ... and then He gave it to us! We stand in awe of His generosity and are humbled daily, by the magnificence of our world.

In company with most churches at this time of year, we will gather together as His people, and our church will be decorated to celebrate the abundance of God's creation.

Here at Park End, as in years past, any fresh food which is collected will be donated to the Huggard which is an organisation helping those who are sleeping rough in Cardiff. The collections of tins, packets and other household goods will be shared with our local Food Banks. There will also be an opportunity to purchase Fair Trade goods for donation at our service as well as a retiring collection to support the work of Water Aid.

As we reflect on God's goodness to us, we should also remember that we are called to be a people of compassion and social justice. In recent years, many Harvest services have resonated with more contemporary concerns such as climate change, and churches have begun to link Harvest themes to those of the stewardship of our earth. We are also challenged to remember those in need and to think about environmental concerns. We continue to pray for the people of the Bahamas, who are in desperate need at this time.

In the last century, archaeologists found wheat and cotton seeds in some of the burial chambers that they excavated. Those seeds (which were probably anywhere from 2,000-4,000 years old) grew when put into the right soil. The spirit of life was still in them, even though they had lain dormant for thousands of years. This is dramatic confirmation that, if a seed is sown, it will do something when it lands in the right kind of soil.

Sometimes we look at the sin and dirt in our lives and don't see anything good. God sees our hearts and sees a good place to plant his Word. If we are open to Him, He brings transformation!

As I write this, Park End is a church in transition. We must always remember, we serve a God who has already blessed us abundantly and has promised to provide for all our needs. With God's grace, we should continue to use this time of waiting, wisely, as we truly seek to discern His will.

Prayerfully we must endeavour to become the people and the church He calls us to be. We must provide the 'rich soil' for His kingdom to flourish.

At this time of Harvest, I pray that He will bless each one of us, that our church family will grow stronger and go forward together into an exciting new chapter in the life of our church

The Sense of a Goose

When you see geese on their annual migrations flying in a "V" formation, you might consider what science has discovered as to why they fly that way. As each bird flaps its wings, it creates an uplift for the bird immediately following. By flying in a "V" formation, the whole flock adds at least 71% greater flying range than if each bird flew on its own.

People who share a common direction and sense of community can get where they are going more quickly and easily, because they are travelling on the thrust of one another.

When a goose falls out of formation, it suddenly feels the drag and resistance of trying to go it alone and quickly gets back into formation to take advantage of the lifting power of the bird in front.

If we have the sense of a goose, we will stay in formation with those people who are heading the same way we are.

When the head goose gets tired, it rotates back in the wing and another goose flies point.

It is sensible to take turns doing demanding jobs, whether with people or with geese flying south.

Geese honk from behind to encourage those up front to keep up their speed.

What message do we give when we honk from behind?

Finally - and this is important - when a goose gets sick or injured and falls out of the formation, two other geese fall out with that goose and follow it down to lend help and protection. They stay with the fallen goose until it is able to fly or until it dies; and only then do they launch out on their own or with another formation to catch up with their own group.

If we have the sense of a goose, we will stand by each other like that.

Ruth is 52 years old and has lived in Mabula village, Zambia, all her life. She has eight children, four boys and four girls.

Her family has always been dependent on the water from the river Ngweze. It takes an hour to walk there and another hour to walk back after collecting water. You have to dig around in the sand of the riverbed to find water.

The water you find there is dirty. The animals in the neighbourhood use the same water source, making the water contaminated. Using this water makes Ruth's family sick, yet that's the only water they have access to, for drinking, cooking or washing.

Ruth says: **"The water we collect from the river is bad, it is not good water. It looks clear but it is not clean and safe. It has a smell and a weird taste."**

Ruth would like to have a garden to grow vegetables but the river is far away and the water she collects runs out quickly. It's not possible to give it to the plants.

Ruth's village used to rely on the rainy season to grow crops, but the weather is changing and it's not raining as much as it used to.

Ruth says: **"This year we have had poor rainfall, our maize was destroyed due to lack of rain. This year we do not have enough food."**

With clean water close to her home, Ruth could make sure her family is safe and healthy. She would be able to grow vegetables to eat and sell, and earn an income to support their livelihood.



"We have very little food, even when I cook food for my family, I ration so that the little we have can take us for a few more days."



Ivy is 35 years old and has been living in Milimo village, Zambia, for the past 12 years. She has four children.

Before WaterAid installed a borehole in her village two years ago, she used to experience the same problems Ruth does in her village.

Their only water source was very far away and they had to wake up as early as 3-4am to face a dangerous journey to the river, long queues and the very tiring task of drawing water.

The dirty water caused a number of waterborne diseases, mostly affecting their children.

When the water project was launched, it brought the village together, with members of the community actively volunteering to help to see the project come to reality.

When they got access to clean water for the very first time, the community decided to start a garden to grow vegetables and raise funds to maintain the borehole.

Milimo now has a flourishing garden where members of the community work together to grow crops and vegetables, and are all committed to taking care of the water point and maintaining it for future generations. Ivy says: **"We no longer stress about water, our children are healthier and are going to school. We are growing a lot for consumption and for selling. Our animals also have water readily available in whatever season of the year."**

Our Harvest Collection at Park End will be going to Water Aid this year. Thank you for your support.

Food Bank Update

As we approach the winter season and with Universal Credit beginning to make life more difficult for certain people, may I ask you to continue to give much needed items of long life milk and long life juice, tinned tomatoes, salmon or tuna, potatoes and rice pudding.

Also a small amount of sweets or chocolates would be welcome, just so that people who suffer real hardship can have a little bit of a treat. Remember "a minute on the lips, a lifetime on the hips", so if someone has given you some sweets or chocolate perhaps you would like to donate it and save yourself from having to go on a diet!!! (tongue in cheek!) Here's a story that will touch your heart.

Holly's Story

Having always worked and never claimed benefits, Holly, 29, from Chichester was bringing up her four-year-old daughter, Phoebe alone. She was determined to give her the best possible start in life, but when Phoebe suddenly fell ill, Holly was forced to turn to a Foodbank for help.

The council flat that Holly was living in was in a deprived area with drug dealing and dog fouling taking place in the corridor outside her door. Holly was adamant that her daughter should have a better environment to grow up in and was offered alternative accommodation near her parents but at double the cost. As well as borrowing money from her parents to meet the cost, Holly was working part time. At the same time, she had been selling second-hand clothes online and the shop she was working in noticed its success and offered her a space selling clothes in their shop.

Under normal circumstances, Holly could just about scrape by, but when her daughter became poorly and had to spend three weeks in hospital, she was forced to close the shop temporarily. When Phoebe recovered, they returned home to empty kitchen cupboards, bills racking up and no income to support them.

Holly felt unable to ask her family for help again and after discussions with the local Citizens Advice Bureau she was referred to the Foodbank. Holly said: "The people at the foodbank were wonderful, they understood

and saved us."

Although Holly's situation is still precarious, knowing the foodbank is there in an emergency is a huge weight off her shoulders.

This may be due to circumstance, infertility or for other reasons - but all are welcome. Babies and children are also invited to come with their family, as the Saying Goodbye service is truly a family event for all.

Although the accident she sustained meant that she was paralysed, it did not hold her back and with the help of her wonderful carers she was able to go out somewhere everyday in her specially adapted car.

As a congregation we will miss her bright smile and her loving manner. We send our love and sympathy to Elaine, Keith, Julie, Martyn and family as they adapt to being without their precious Louise.
